Following the last year's practice, we implemented a judging procedure consisting of two rounds: We selected three finalists before the SAAs and announced them broadly through social media; then our judges interviewed the finalists on the ground and selected the winner and an honorable mention. This year's winner is Sophie Forbes (The University of Georgia), and her poster is entitled "Five Thousand Years of Oyster Harvesting on Ossabaw Island, Georgia: A Sclerochronological Analysis." An honorable mention went to Olumide Ojediran (University of Colorado Boulder), whose poster is entitled "Understanding Human-Equid Relationships in Old Oyo Empire, West Africa."
