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## SAS Student Ambassador Program

The program, launched in 2019, is part of our new professional development and outreach programs. ### R.E. Taylor Student Poster Award Competition at the SAA 2024

We held R.E. Taylor Poster Award at the 89<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the SAA in New Orleans, April 17-21, 2024. We received nine applications. Following the last year's practice, we implemented a judging procedure consisting of two rounds: We selected three finalists before the SAAs and announced them broadly through social media; then our judges interviewed the finalists and selected the winner and an honorable mention. This year's winner is Samantha Mahan (University of Missouri), and her poster is entitled "Microanalysis of Late Stone Age Rock Art Ochre Pigments in Eswatini." An honorable mention went to Nadia Neff (University of New Mexico), whose poster is entitled "Tracking the Origins of Animal Management in a Neotropical Foraging-to Farming Population using Carbon Stable Isotope Analysis of Lysine."
