The transfer of editorship went quite smoothly at the beginning of this calendar year. Most of the associate editors stayed on, with a few exceptions. Between the first issue of this year and the second, two associate editors stepped down, so the Bulletin is now in need of a volunteer to edit the Book Review and Archaeological Chemistry sections.

In terms of publishing and distribution, bigger changes were made. The Bulletin is now printed in-house at IU South Bend, a student and I handle the addresses and bundling, and the university brings the pieces to the Post Office to ship domestically. The international shipping is handled by a firm in Kalamazoo, Michigan. Altogether, I think these new procedures save the Society in costs per issue mailed (it is now about \$350/issue, but I don't have the previous figures).

Although I would like the assembled officers at this business meeting or one in the near future to discuss the possibility of providing the Bulletin online to most members and charging a premium for a hard copy, I have a few reservations. The bulk rate for domestic mail is applicable to 200 pieces or more. We currently send out only a couple more than that minimum. Further, many of the Bulletins go to library and periodical holdings. We wouldn't want to lose the continuity or visibility at those institutions. On the other hand, color figures and better resolution of graphics are available through electronic copies.
